Re: Confirmation of Wasauksing First Nation (WFN) Jurisdiction

Dear WLI Board Members,

We wanted to take this opportunity to clarify a number of matters in relation to WFN's jurisdiction and a number of other items pertaining to Wasausink Lands Inc. (WLI), the Head Lease and Sub Lease.

WFN is and continues to be the only governing authority over all Wasauksing Land, including the lands leased to WLI, will full entitlement to pass land and environmental laws, by-laws, rules, regulations and orders on our lands. WFN reserves the rights to pass all such laws not inconsistent with its contractual commitments under the Head Lease.

WLI only has those rights, responsibilities and powers as set out in the Head Lease and, with respect to its tenants solely, in the Sub Lease documents. The Head Lease (and, to the best of our knowledge, the Sub Leases) **do not** give power to WLI to regulate lands, issues fines, charge application/request fees (other than a \$100 rent charge for an assignment of a lease), pass laws, policies or regulations in respect to our land, building codes, shoreline alterations or environment in lieu of or instead of WFN.

We can also confirm that WFN has not delegated any additional authority to WLI to act on WFN's behalf or otherwise bind WFN to any commitments. WLI does not speak for WFN or our community, and your actions in dealing with the lease lands must be restricted to your contractual rights.

Please also find attached our Band Council Resolution confirming such and voiding any and all actions taken by WLI outside of its authority.

We trust that this clears up any misunderstandings around jurisdiction and authority.
